

For at least 20 years (1972-1992) the Soviet Union hid a ~65,000 person offensive biological weapons program. This Soviet program had at least five R&D centers and 7 massive mobilization production centers with weapons filling stations. These were not defensive vaccine research centers. They produced tons of weaponized anthrax, plague, smallpox genetically modified for virulence and designed to bypass existing vaccines. The Soviet Union and now Russia has lied continually about the existence of the program. While we missed a few dozen attackers on 9.11, missing 65,000 people in a weapons program was the largest failure of U.S. intelligence in American history. It was the largest failure of the U.S. arms negotiations. This book lays it all out in

excruciating and painful detail. This book is the reference standard for the history of the Soviet biological weapons program.

This is the most comprehensive book written about the Cold War development of biological weapons in the Former Soviet Union. It is amazing to think that such a large program was hidden from the world for so long. Both Leitenberg and Zilinskas are excellent writers and although the text is a daunting 1000 pages it actually reads quite easily. I recommend this book to history buffs, scientists, military personnel and anyone interested in how it came to be that our world is frightened about the spread of diseases and the threat of biological warfare.
